


## **Interviewing Care Providers**

## Interview questions for in-home aides and nurses

- 1. Tell me about yourself.
- 2. Tell me about your experience caring for a child with (your child's condition).
- 3. Tell me about your pediatric experience.
- 4. What do you like most and least about doing in-home care?
- 5. Why did you leave your last case?
- 6. Have you ever been fired or asked to leave a case?
- 7. Thinking about the families you have worked with in the past, what would they say about your attendance and timeliness?
- 8. Can you tell me about a time when you dealt with an emergency with a patient? What happened, what did you do, and what was the outcome?
- 9. What is your availability to work?
- 10. Are you willing to fill in for other nurses if necessary? Are there days or times when you are absolutely not available?
- 11. Besides following the doctor's orders in the care plan, how else do you assist or support your patients and their families?
- 12. Tell me about a situation where you disagreed with a parent about the appropriate way to care for their child. How did you handle it?
- 13. Do you smoke?
- 14. How long have you worked for this agency?
- 15. Which other agencies have you worked for and when?
- 16. What questions do you have for me/us?
